NOMINATION AND APPLICATION PROCESS

Exchange coordinators nominate students online. Login information is sent to partner institutions before the nomination portal opens. The following student data is required:

- First name and family name
- Date of birth
- Citizenship
- E-mail address
- Duration of stay: 1 or 2 semesters
- Programme: Exchange/Double Degree/QTEM/Summer School

Nomination deadlines:

- 25 April for Autumn semester
 - 25 September for Spring semester
- Nominated exchange student apply online. Link to the online application form is automatically sent to students by e-mail after nomination.

Students must upload the following documents with the application:

- Motivation letter
- Copy of passport (page with photo)
- Recent academic transcript

Application deadlines:

- 1 May for Autumn semester
- 1 October for Spring semester

HOUSING

BI guarantees off-campus housing to all international students who apply correctly within the deadline 1 May/1 October. Application fee of NOK 1000 applies to all.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE SKILLS

No English language test is required from nominated exchange students. Partners are trusted to select students with a high level of English proficiency.

Recommended: level B2; TOEFL 78; IELTS 6.0.

STUDY PERMIT AND ENTRY VISA

All student staying in Norway for more than 3 months must register with the Norwegian Immigration Authorities. The procedures differ according to the nationality of the student:

- Citizens of countries outside the EU/EEA must apply for a study permit (and entry visa, if applicable) before coming to Norway.
- Citizens of EU/EEA countries must register with authorities when they arrive in Norway.
