### What are you doing?


- 1. Full Term Exchange: on exchange full-time at one of our partner schools for a full term and/or registered in the equivalent of 9–18 Schulich credits
- 2. Short Exchange: on exchange at one of our partner schools and registered in the equivalent of 3-6 Schulich credits
- **3. Short Program**: attending a structured program at one of our partner schools and registered in the equivalent of 3-6 Schulich credits

**Study Tour**: a 1.5 or 3 credit Schulich course where you attend lectures at Schulich (pre-travel) then travel to the destination for school and company visits

- Submit a complete exchange application found on the Graduate International Opportunities website
















#### **SELECTION**

### What is the selection criteria?

- Flexibility (the more schools chosen means greater chance of being matched)
- Professionalism
- Ability to be a good ambassador for Schulich



#### **DECISIONS**

### When will I know



- Decisions will be made in mid <u>March</u>
- You will receive an email and a letter indicating where you have been matched
- You will have until <u>late March</u> to accept or decline the offer



# ACADEMIC PLANNING Courses on exchange

- Full-time exchange the equivalent of 12 15 SSB credits
- Credits taken abroad are **business electives** 
  - MBA students: a maximum of 2 exchange courses (equivalent to 6 SSB credits) can be used towards a specialization
  - IMBA students: 1 course (equivalent to 3 SSB credits) can be used towards a specialization
  - Can enrol in a language course but it does not count towards your Schulich credits


## ACADEMIC PLANNING Credits for Graduation

- <u>All</u> courses are transferred to Schulich on a pass/fail basis and appear on your York transcript
  - Passes do not impact GPA but <u>failures</u> do
- To fulfill your residency requirement, students must complete a minimum 24 credits here at Schulich



- T1 (WI): core courses
- T2 (SU): core courses +
   SGMT 6000/6901
- T3 (FA): exchange + MGMT 6090 & 6100 (601)
- T4 (WI): electives & completing 601

Switch SGMT 6000 and an elective if going on exchange in the fall term



#### **ACADEMIC PLANNING**

### Full term exchange (part-time students & the 601)

- Exchange term after Term 5
   (MBA Year 2)
- May be possible to switch SGMT 6000 and an Elective depending on your situation
  - \*Speak with an Academic Advisor (Fern or April) to confirm



## ACADEMIC PLANNING Full term exchange (accelerated students)

Two most common options are:

#### Option 1:

Term 1: 12/15 cr. at Schulich (f/t)

Term 2: 12/9 cr. at Schulich (f/t)

Term 3: 12 cr. on Exchange (f/t)

#### Option 2:

Term 1: 16.5 cr. at Schulich (f/t)

Term 2: 7.5 cr. at Schulich (p/t)

Term 3: 12 cr. on Exchange (f/t)

# CAREER PLANNING Can it still happen?

- Network before you go: use the time between selection and departure wisely!
- Continuous access to the SSB Career Centre on-line
- Skype interviews
- Opportunity to develop new networks with your class abroad
- Company may be recruiting at that school while you are there
- Opportunity to network with a company that recruits abroad and not here
