PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA Study Permit and Entry to Canada

Study Permit and TRV/eTA

- International students studying for longer than 6 months require a <u>study permit</u> to study inside Canada
 - COVID-19: You are strongly encouraged to apply for your study permit before 15 September 2020.
 - Study permit is not required before starting online from overseas (is required if you are physically in Canada)
 - For PGWP eligibility, must <u>apply for study permit before 15 September</u>
- Review the <u>application guide</u>, <u>supporting documents</u> and <u>processing times</u> before applying
 - Attend a <u>Study Permit webinar</u> if you need additional support. Next session: 31 July 2020
- Depending on your <u>country of citizenship</u>, you will also be issued a temporary resident visa (TRV) or electronic travel authorization (eTA) to enter Canada (exception for US citizens)
- Upon approval, you should receive a <u>Letter of Introduction</u> from the visa office; required to board a flight
- Remember, being exempt from the travel restrictions and authorized to board your flight does not guarantee that you will be permitted entry to Canada
 - Entry to Canada is at discretion of border officer
- Continue to monitor <u>IRCC COVID-19 website</u>. Information may change without notice.

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA Study Permit and Entry to Canada

Work Authorization

- Your study permit may <u>authorize you to work</u> in Canada. Authorization begins only after you start your classes at Schulich
- More detailed information on work authorization and immigration status will be provided at the International Student Orientation

Accompanying Family Members

- Your spouse/partner and children may be eligible to <u>come with you</u> to Canada. Accompanying spouses/partners are eligible to apply for an open work permit
- Will require a "travel authorization letter" in addition to visa approval (based on current travel restrictions)

Social Insurance Number (SIN)

- The SIN is a 9-digit number that you need to work in Canada and file your taxes. You can apply for a SIN with a valid study permit that states work authorization (check this when they print your permit at the point of entry)
- You may apply for one in person (if offices are open):
 - a) From the Service Canada office at Pearson Airport (after passing through Immigration) Office hours vary
 - b) From any other Service Canada location. For more information, please visit Service Canada website
 - Online application during COVID-19 Service Canada closure

COVID-19 CONSIDERATIONS

Travel Restrictions

Travel restrictions extended until 31 July 2020

- 1. Must have **study permit approval** on or before 18 March 2020 (for entry from all countries other than the USA)
- 2. Must have an essential (non-optional) purpose for entering Canada
- 3. Must pass a **health check** at the port of departure
- 4. Must have plan to **<u>quarantine for 14 days</u>** after arrival

"Non-optional purpose of travel"

- Both IRCC and CBSA are discouraging those who are studying completely online in Fall 2020 from entering Canada
- Onus is on you to demonstrate that your entry to Canada is non-optional/essential
 - Online studies are considered "non-essential" reason
 - Consideration of personal factors preventing you from studying online (internet/timezone issues, etc)
- Risk of refusal at border if no in-person requirement for you to be in Canada
- Travel to Canada at this time is at your own risk

All students in Canada or planning to enter Canada MUST inform Schulich before travelling

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA

COVID-19: Self-Quarantine

Upon arrival, all individuals are required by law to immediately quarantine for 14 days

- Must have a plan in place to fulfill <u>quarantine requirement</u>
 - Use private vehicle from airport
 - Proof of suitable accommodations
 - Must wear a mask while travelling until you reach your accommodation
- Go straight to place of accommodation
 - York U is developing quarantine plan; details being finalized
 - Most hotels are available for quarantine
 - AirBnb *may* be available
 - Must contact landlord and clarify terms of stay
- 14-day quarantine period; fines for non-compliance
 - Cannot leave quarantine accommodation, unless requiring medical attention
 - Do not use public transportation
 - Do not have visitors
 - Contact your "<u>Quarantine Buddy</u>" for information and resources; may need to organize deliveries/services in advance of your arrival (food, cleaning supplies, etc.)
 - Contact International Relations for quarantine guide



PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA

Accommodation

It is your responsibility to secure accommodations in Toronto. Consider the type of accommodation that is best for you by researching costs, location, etc.

On-Campus Housing

- Housing for graduate students and families
- Lease-based occupancy
- Furnished and unfurnished apartments (note: bedding, small appliances, dishes, etc. are not included)
- York University finalizing an arrival plan to assist with quarantine requirement. Details will be sent once confirmed
- If not arriving for Fall, you can defer your offer to Winter

Off-Campus Housing

- There are many options to search for off-campus housing, including:
 - York University Off-Campus Housing Service
 - Places4Students Off-Campus Housing Website
 - <u>The Quad</u> off-campus student residence within 2 min walk to Schulich

 - Contact IR for off-campus housing resources

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA

Health Insurance



University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP)

- <u>Mandatory</u> for all international students and dependents who are physically in Canada (dependents must be enrolled within 30 days of arrival to avoid a \$500 late fee)
- Coverage includes:
 - doctor's visits and hospital accommodation in Ontario
 - <u>emergency</u> services only in Canada (health insurance should be purchased for travel outside of Canada)
- Does not cover medications, routine dental care, etc. (supplemental insurance recommended)
- The approximate cost is \$720 (Sep 1st Aug 31st)*
- Students are automatically registered by the University; must <u>notify Schulich</u> of arrival in Canada
- Coverage begins on the 10th day of the month prior to the month of the first day of classes (i.e. April 10th, Aug. 10th or Dec 10th). If arriving earlier, ensure you have your own private insurance

Graduate Student Association (GSA) Supplemental Insurance

- Full-time students who are physically in Canada are <u>automatically</u> registered (dependents can be enrolled)
- Coverage includes items such as prescription drugs, paramedical services, dental benefits, etc.
- To be exempt, students must provide proof of an alternative coverage to the GSA Office
- The approximate cost is \$410 from Sept 1st Aug 31st*

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA What to Bring

COVID-19 Note: Travel to Canada at this time is at your own risk, given the current travel restrictions. Entry is not guaranteed.

Review what to <u>expect at the airport</u> when you arrive in Canada as an international student. If you are arriving as a permanent resident, please also review <u>PR arrival requirements</u>. Download the <u>ArriveCAN app</u>.

- □ Address where you will be residing*
- □ Quarantine Plan*
- Photocopies/digital copies of important documents (and send to your email)*
- Medications, health documents and prescriptions (if applicable); check <u>import limits</u> for medications

- Medical insurance documents for any additional health/travel coverage (if applicable)
- Driver's license or international driver's license (drivetest.ca)
- □ Unlocked phone
- □ Laptop

- $\hfill\square$ Business attire for presentations and career events

- □ Credit card(s) and money for immediate use upon arrival

* Pack in your carry-on luggage as you will be <u>required to</u> <u>show these to the border officer</u> upon arrival (before getting your checked luggage)

Transportation from Pearson Airport

COVID-19: You MUST use private transportation from the airport; you are prohibited from using public transportation (bus, subway, train)

Airport Taxi (recommended)

- Fare: \$50-60 CAD approximately (baggage handling and tipping the driver are extra)
- Travel time: Approximately 30 minutes to the York campus
- Taxis will be waiting once you exit the airport terminal. Use only authorized taxi providers

Ride-Hailing Apps

- Fare: \$50 CAD approximately
- Use <u>Uber</u> or <u>Lyft</u> to and from airport (Uber Black and Lyft Lux are more expensive)

States of Emergency & Physical Distancing Rules

- In force in Ontario and City of Toronto
- Stage 2 of "<u>Reopening Ontario</u>" plan in Toronto partial reopening of some businesses/services (patio restaurants, salons, retail businesses, parks, etc)

- Cost: \$6 for card + \$10 minimum load/reload
- Load in advance may take up to 24 hours to reload on-line
- Manage your card at: <u>My PRESTO</u> to add funds & passes and manage your profile
- Fares may vary between systems
- Additional fare when transferring between systems
- Tap your card to pay
- Hop on/off any direction for 2 hours without being charged again from the 1st time you tap on
- Research Post-Secondary Monthly Pass on PRESTO to save money on each transportation system


