YORK UNIVERSITY VIRTUAL LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

“As this meeting is virtual and we are not all gathered in the same space, I recognize that this land acknowledgment might not be for the territory that you are currently on. We ask that if this is the case, you take the responsibility to acknowledge the traditional territory you are on and the current treaty holders. As a member of the York University community, I recognize that many Indigenous Nations have longstanding relationships with the territories upon which York University campuses are located that precede the establishment of York University. This territory is subject of the Dish with One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, an agreement to peaceably share and care for the Great Lakes region.”

What are you doing?

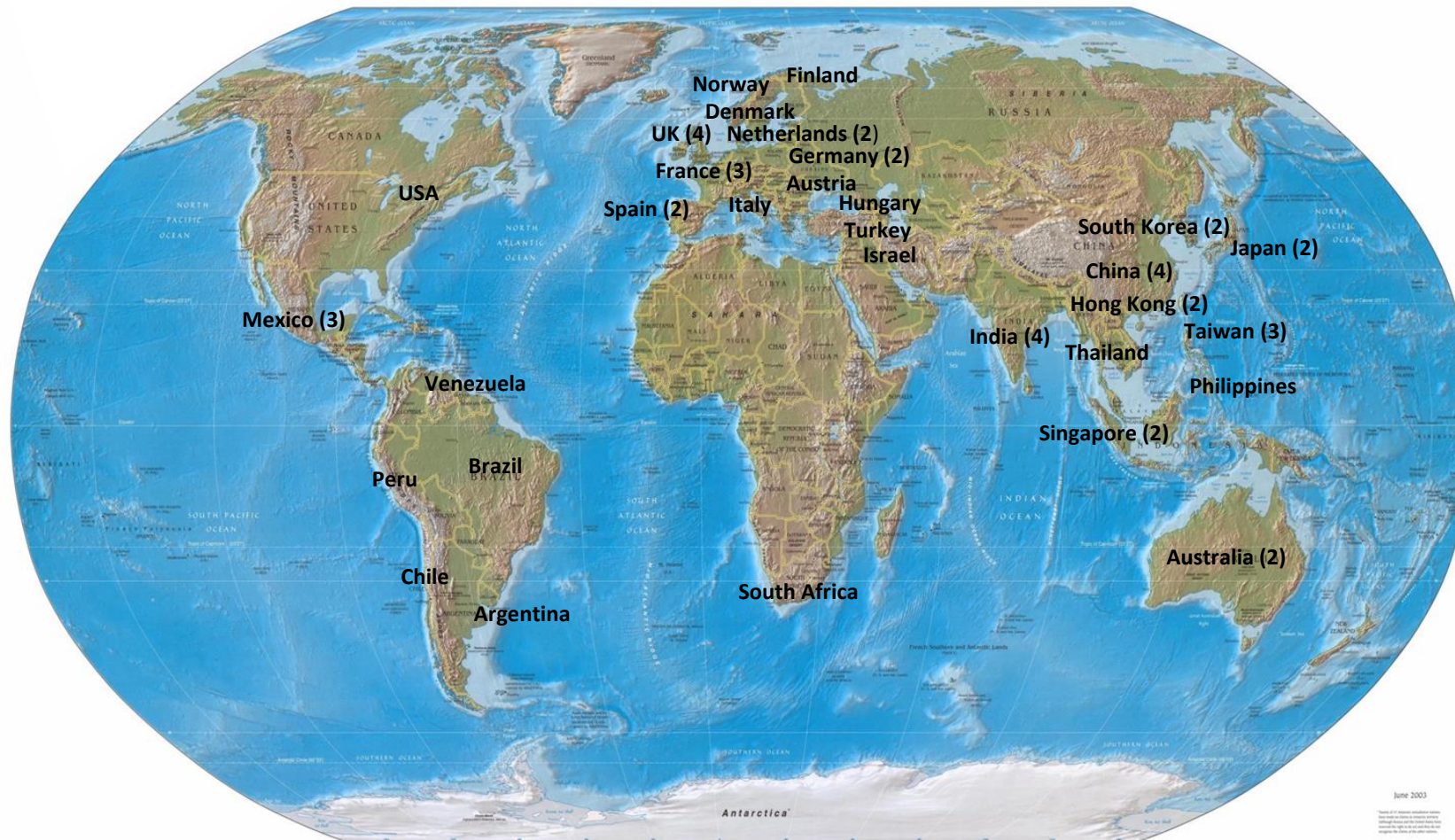
1. **Full Term Exchange:** on exchange full-time at one of our partner schools for a full term and/or registered in the equivalent of 9–18 Schulich credits
2. **Short Exchange*:** on exchange at one of our partner schools and registered in the equivalent of 3-6 Schulich credits
3. **Short Program*:** attending a structured program at one of our partner schools and registered in the equivalent of 3-6 Schulich credits
 - Usually has a program fee to cover costs such as welcome dinner, cultural activities, transportation, accommodations (optional), etc.

* Credits can be added to a term if you have room (max. 18 credits/term)

Can I go?

- Successful completion of all 5000-level required courses prior to departure
- A cumulative GPA of at least 5.0

- Submit a complete exchange application found on the [Graduate International Opportunities website](#)




APPLICATION



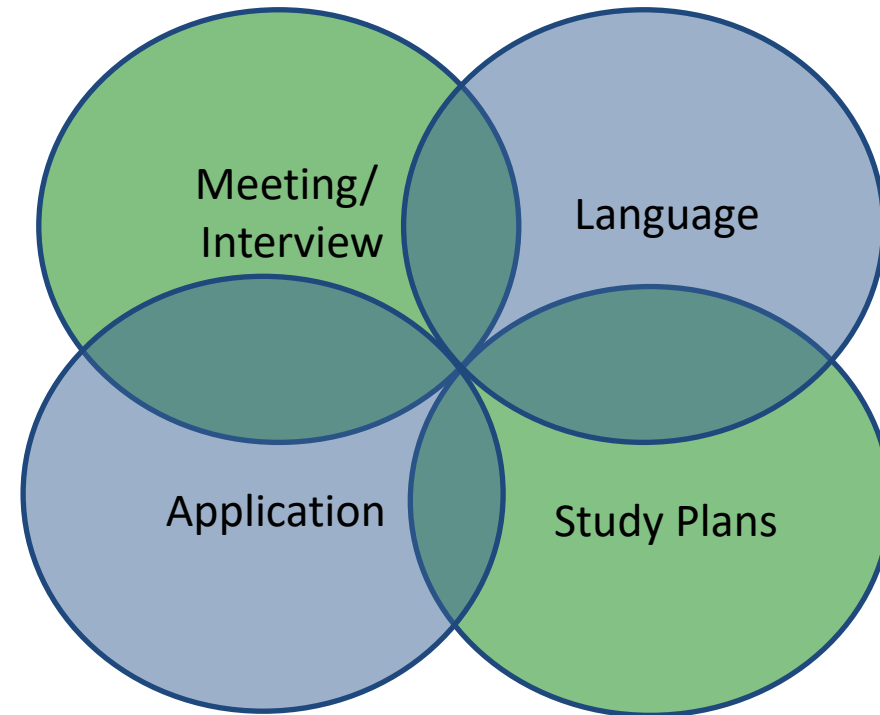

- Ability to be a good ambassador for Schulich

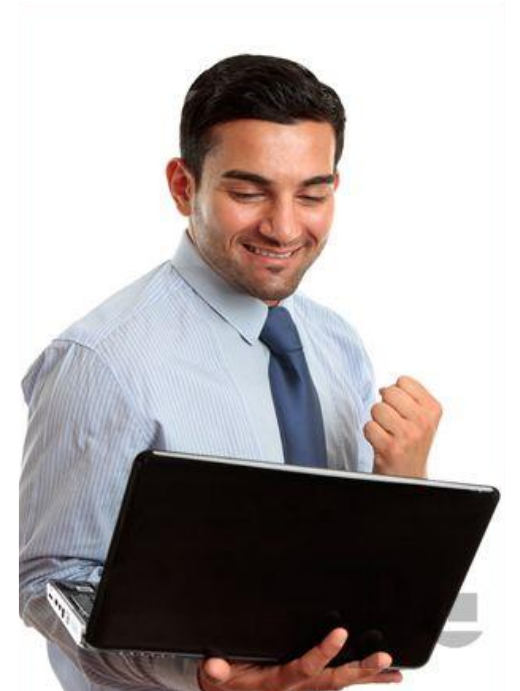


DECISIONS

When will I know



- Decisions will be made in mid-March
- You will receive an email and a letter indicating where you have been matched
- You will have until late March to accept or decline the offer



ACADEMIC PLANNING

Courses on exchange

- Full-time exchange - the equivalent of 9 - 15 SSB credits
- Credits taken abroad are **business electives**
 - MBA students: a maximum of 2 exchange courses (equivalent to 6 SSB credits) can be used towards a specialization
 - IMBA students: 1 course (equivalent to 3 SSB credits) can be used towards a specialization
 - Can enrol in a language course but it does not count towards your Schulich credits

ACADEMIC PLANNING

Credits for Graduation

- All courses are transferred to Schulich on a pass/fail basis and appear on your York transcript
 - Passes do not impact GPA but failures do
- To fulfill your residency requirement, students must complete a minimum 24 credits here at Schulich

There are other options as well

ACADEMIC PLANNING

Full term exchange (accelerated students)

- Two most common options are:

Option 1:

Term 1: 12/15 cr. at Schulich (f/t)

Term 2: 12/9 cr. at Schulich (f/t)

Term 3: 12 cr. on Exchange (f/t)

Option 2:

Term 1: 16.5 cr. at Schulich (f/t)

Term 2: 7.5 cr. at Schulich (p/t)

Term 3: 12 cr. on Exchange (f/t)

- For a short exchange/program may not have to extend program

CAREER PLANNING

Can it still happen?

- Network before you go: use the time between selection and departure wisely!
- Continuous access to the SSB Career Centre on-line
- Skype/Zoom interviews
- Opportunity to develop new networks with your class abroad
- Company may be recruiting at that school while you are there
- Opportunity to network with a company that recruits abroad and not here
