PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA

Winter 2022

- ❑ All classes for the Winter 2022 term will be **in person**
- ❑ Plan to be physically present in Canada and prepared to attend classes in person by January 10, 2022 (Winter 2022)
- ❑ **Remote Access Accommodation:** In limited circumstances, if you are unable to attend classes in person by January 10th due to one of the situations below, you can request temporary accommodation to attend classes remotely for up to two weeks only.
 - Study permit / visa delay
 - Border closures
 - 14-day quarantine requirement
- ❑ The Accommodation Request form will be shared the week of November 29th



PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA

Vaccine Mandate

**Anyone accessing the York U campus in January 2022 must provide
PROOF OF VACCINATION!**

[What does it mean to be fully vaccinated?](#)**

The full series of a Health Canada-approved COVID-19 vaccine and any combination of such vaccines;

- One or two doses of a [COVID-19 vaccine](#) that is not authorized by Health Canada, followed by one dose of a COVID-19 mRNA vaccine authorized by Health Canada; **or**
- Three doses of a COVID-19 vaccine that is not authorized by Health Canada; **and**
- It has been at least 14 days since their final dose of their COVID-19 vaccine.

If you are considered fully vaccinated as described above, no further vaccination is required at this time. Please ensure you upload your proof of vaccination to [YU Screen](#) as soon as possible.



ACTION ITEM!

IMMEDIATELY: Disclose your vaccination status through YU Screen.

DECEMBER 1st: UPLOAD your PROOF OF VACCINATION

**The term "fully vaccinated" refers to the Ontario government and York University's access to campus policy.

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA

Questions

What if I am not able to arrive in Canada by the start of classes?

- You may be able to request temporary remote access for the first two weeks if your delay is due to study permit/visa delay, travel restrictions or quarantine requirement. Remote access will only be granted for up to weeks (up to January 24th)
- If you will be delayed beyond this date OR for reasons not listed above, you should speak to your academic advisor about taking a leave of absence or deferring your admission

What if I am not fully vaccinated by the start of classes?

- Accommodations are being developed for international students who are not fully vaccinated
- Details will be provided as soon as they are available
- You should make every effort to be fully vaccinated by December 1st or the start of classes

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA

Immigration Documents

- International students must apply for a study permit, if they are completing a program longer than 6 months in Canada. **You should have already applied for your study permit.**
 - If you are **OUTSIDE** of Canada:
 - Must apply [for your study permit](#) prior to the start of your program; processing times may be lengthy
 - Review the [application guide](#), [supporting documents](#) and [processing times](#) before applying
 - Attend the [Study Permit Webinar](#) on **December 6, 2021**, if you need additional support.
 - If you are **INSIDE** Canada:
 - Must have a valid study permit before starting your classes
- Depending on your [country of citizenship](#) to enter Canada you will require:
 - Temporary Resident Visa (TRV); or
 - Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA); or
 - US Passport
- [Letter of Introduction](#) (study permit approval letter) will be sent by IRCC, you will need to show this letter at the border.
- Study permit will be issued at the border when you arrive

What if my study permit is still in process?

- We recommend requesting a Study Permit Support letter from Student Services and uploading to IRCC webform

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA

Visas and Work Authorization

Work Authorization

- Your study permit may [authorize you to work](#) in Canada. Authorization begins only after you start your classes in Canada
- More detailed information on work authorization and immigration status available during Pre-Orientation Essential Information Sessions in December 2021

Accompanying Family Members

- Your spouse/partner and children may be eligible to [come with you](#) to Canada. Accompanying spouses/partners are eligible to apply for an [open work permit](#)
- May require a "[travel authorization letter](#)" in addition to visa approval (based on current travel restrictions)

Social Insurance Number (SIN)

- The SIN is a 9-digit number that you need to work in Canada and file your taxes. You can apply for a SIN with a valid study permit that states work authorization (**check this when they print your permit at the point of entry**)
- You may apply for one [in person](#) (if offices are open):
 - a) From the Service Canada office at Pearson Airport (after passing through Immigration) – Office hours vary
 - b) From any other Service Canada location. For more information, please visit [Service Canada](#) website

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA

Travel Restrictions/Exemptions

Travel exemptions for international students:

1. Must have **appropriate travel documents** (i.e: study permit approval)
 - Visa/eTA/US passport **and** Letter of Introduction from visa office
2. University must have an approved COVID-readiness plan
 - York University is an [approved DLI](#)
3. Must have [negative COVID test](#) taken within 72 hrs of departure
4. Must have negative COVID test taken within 18 hrs of departure, if travelling direct from India.
5. Cannot be entering Canada for an optional purpose*
6. Must have **valid immigration medical** exam
 - Exams are valid for 1 year from date of exam
7. Must show proof of enrollment. Make request for [Confirmation of Enrollment with Entry Support](#) Letter from Schulich **by December 13, 2021.**
8. Must have plan to [quarantine for 14 days](#) after arrival
 - York University is offering quarantine accommodation upon request
9. May be required to undergo COVID [test upon arrival](#)

Request [Confirmation of Enrollment with Entry Support](#) letter by December 13, 2021.

You should only arrive 3-4 weeks prior to the start of your Winter 2022 term.

*Optional/non-optional purpose of travel

- Students with an approved study permit and coming to study at an institution with an approved COVID-readiness plan will be considered to be travelling for a [non-optional purpose](#), regardless of mode of program delivery

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA

Required Steps

Before travelling to Canada, you must complete the following:

Review York University [Essential Information for International Travelers](#)

University Requirements

At least 3 weeks before you travel:

- Complete the York University [Travel to Canada/Quarantine Accommodation Form](#)

At least by December 13, 2021

- Request a [Confirmation of Enrollment with Entry Support letter](#) from Schulich

Canadian Government requirements

- Obtain [negative COVID test](#) taken within 72 hrs before travel
- Direct flights from India must obtain negative COVID-test taken within 18 hrs before travel
- Download the [ArriveCAN app](#) and submit your travel and quarantine information to the Canadian government before boarding your flight

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA

Mandatory Quarantine

- Must have a plan in place before travelling to fulfill 14-day [quarantine requirement](#)
 - If you have a Health Canada approved vaccine, you may be exempt from quarantine requirements; however must still have a back-up quarantine plan

Two Options:

- 1) York U Quarantine Accommodation Program; **OR**
- 2) Self-Arranged Quarantine

York U Quarantine Accommodation Program

- No-cost quarantine hotel accommodations available (*recommended*)
 - Fully vaccinated - can use as [back-up quarantine plan](#)
 - Shuttle provided from airport;
 - Basic accommodations and meals;
 - Requests for upgrades, etc cannot be considered

Self Arranged Quarantine

- Review [quarantine requirements](#)
- Fully vaccinated grad students – can use your on-campus residence as quarantine plan

As of July 5, 2021 fully vaccinated travelers are exempt from some quarantine requirements:

- Only Health Canada approved vaccines are accepted
- Received last dose at least 14 days prior to arrival
- Must still have a plan to quarantine

Mandatory! Must Complete York U [Travel to Canada/Quarantine Accommodation Form](#) at least 3 weeks before travel date, regardless of where you intend to quarantine

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA

Accommodation

It is your responsibility to secure accommodations in Toronto. Consider the type of accommodation that is best for you by researching costs, location, etc.

On-Campus Housing – York Apartments

- Housing for graduate students and families
- Lease-based occupancy
- Furnished and unfurnished apartments - you will need to obtain your own bedding, small kitchen appliances and other items

University Health Insurance



University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP)


- Mandatory for all international students and dependents who are physically in Canada
 - Dependents must be enrolled within 30 days of arrival to avoid \$500 late fee
- Coverage includes services such as doctor's visits and hospital accommodation in Ontario and emergency services in Canada.
- UHIP does not cover medications, routine dental care, etc (*supplemental insurance recommended*)
- The approximate cost is \$504 (Jan 1st – Aug 31st) *
- Your coverage will begin on 10th day of the month prior to your program start (i.e.: Dec 10th); if arriving earlier, ensure you have your own private insurance.

Graduate Student Association (GSA) Supplemental Insurance

- All full-time students are automatically registered and charged
 - Check your [student account](#) for the GSA Health plan charge (you should also receive an email from the YUGSA Health Plan Office).
- Email the YUGSA Office at health@yugsa.ca (include your student number) if:
 - You are not in Canada (to have the charge reversed)
 - You are in Canada and you do not see a charge
 - You already have supplemental health insurance and are seeking approval for an exemption
- Coverage includes items such as prescription drugs, paramedical services, dental benefits, etc.
- The approximate cost is \$340 from Jan 1st – Aug 31st*
- If you're in Canada and have **dependents** contact: Wespeakstudent.com to have them enrolled
- **Deadline for all to opt-in, opt-out or change plan option: Feb 28, 2022**

When to Arrive and What to Bring

Important Items to Pack

- Valid Passport, with your Temporary Resident Visa (TRV) / eTA; or US passport*
- Letter of Introduction letter from visa office*
- Your Schulich Letter of Acceptance (*printed copy acceptable*)*
- [Confirmation of Enrollment with Entry Support](#) letter (*recently dated*) *
- Proof of funds*
- Quarantine Plan*
- Ensure your immigration medical exam is still valid
- Photocopies/digital copies of important documents (and send to your email)
- Medications, health documents and prescriptions (if applicable); check [import limits](#) for medications

- Proof of vaccination
- Credit Cards
- Documents for extended health care insurance, if applicable
- Driver's license or international driver's license ([drivetest.ca](#)); driver's abstract/history
- Unlocked phone
- Laptop
- Power type A and B: Standard voltage is 120V, standard frequency is 60Hz <https://www.power-plugs-sockets.com/canada/>
- Business attire for presentations and career events
- Weather appropriate clothing for [the season](#)
- Canadian dollars or cash to exchange for immediate use

ARRIVAL IN TORONTO

Transport from Pearson International Airport

COVID-19: You MUST use private transportation from the airport; you are prohibited from using public transportation (bus, subway, train); shuttle provided for York U Quarantine

Airport Taxi (recommended)

- Taxi fares from the airport are based on a flat rate tariff.
- Fare : \$50-60 CAD approximately (tips and extra luggage fee extra).
- Travel time: 30 minutes to York campus.
- Taxis will be waiting once you exit the airport terminal. Use only authorized taxi providers.

- Uber Rider kiosk available as you leave baggage area




COVID-19 IN TORONTO

What does this mean for me?

Ontario Reopening Plan

- “A Plan to Safely Reopen Ontario and Manage COVID-19 for the Long-Term” – in effect as of Oct 25, 2021
- Review covid-19.ontario.ca for all provincial COVID information
- Proof of vaccination will be required in [many indoor public spaces](#)
 - Consider obtaining an [enhanced vaccine certificate](#) with QR code for easier access
 - Must register non-Ontario vaccine doses with local public health unit
- Capacity limits lifted in many settings where proof of vaccine is required
- Must wear a mask in all indoor public spaces, including transit system
- Must practice physical distancing (2 metres apart)
- Monitor the [Toronto COVID-19 website](#) and [Toronto Public Health Measures](#)



ARRIVAL IN TORONTO

COVID-19 at York U

As York U community members, we all have a responsibility to keep the campus safe

- Must have [WHO or Health Canada approved vaccination](#) and [upload vaccination proof](#)
- Before entering campus, must complete [COVID Screening Checklist](#)
- [Daily screening](#) required for those living on campus
- Cannot enter campus if you have been outside Canada in previous 14 days or not vaccinated
- Must wear a mask in all indoor spaces (i.e.: York Lanes, common areas in residence)
- Most buildings and services are open on campus
- Remote services are available such as mental health and wellness, academic advising, etc
- Must practice physical distancing





ARRIVAL IN TORONTO

Presto Card

[PRESTO](#) is accepted on all GTA transit systems

- Purchase a PRESTO card
 - [Online](#)
 - at a PRESTO vending machine (TTC subway stations)
 - at a [customer service outlet](#)
 - at Shopper's Drug Mart locations that sell PRESTO cards
- Cost: \$6 for card + \$0.05 minimum load/reload if purchased in person or \$5/\$10 minimum from a vending machine
- Load in advance - may take up to 24 hours to reload on-line
- Manage your card at: [My PRESTO](#) to add funds & passes and manage your profile
- Fares may vary between systems
- Additional fare when transferring between systems
- Tap your card to pay
- Hop on/off any direction for 2 hours without being charged again from the 1st time you tap on
- Research [Post-Secondary Monthly Pass](#) on PRESTO to save money on each transportation system
