

Immigration Documents

Study Permits

- International students studying for longer than 6 months require a study permit to study inside Canada
- You must have a valid study permit prior to the start of the program

Continue to monitor <u>IRCC</u> COVID-19 website

If you are outside of Canada:

- Apply online for your study permit. APPLY AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, as processing times are lengthy.
- Review the <u>application guide</u>, <u>supporting documents</u> and <u>processing times</u> before applying.
- Depending on your <u>country of citizenship</u>, you will also be issued a temporary resident visa (TRV) or electronic travel authorization (eTA) to enter Canada (exception for US citizens)
- Upon approval, you should receive a Letter of Introduction from the visa office; required to board a flight
- Study permit will be issued at the border when you arrive

If you are inside Canada with a valid study permit:

- You should apply to extend your study permit BEFORE your current permit expires
- You can begin your program with your current study permit IF it is still valid, or if you apply to extend your current permit before it expires
- Your new permit will be mailed to you

Visas and Work Authorization

Work Authorization

- Your study permit may <u>authorize you to work</u> in Canada. Authorization begins only after you start your classes in Canada
- More detailed information on work authorization and immigration status available during International Student Orientation on August 25 and August 26, 2022.

Social Insurance Number (SIN)

- The SIN is a 9-digit number that you need to work in Canada and file your taxes. You can apply for a SIN with a valid study permit that states work authorization (check this when you receive your study permit document)
- You may apply for one <u>online</u>:
 - a) From the Service Canada Virtual SIN Clinic at Fall 2022 Orientation (recommended)
 - b) From the Service Canada Online Application Portal
- You may apply for one in person :
 - a) From the Service Canada office at Pearson Airport (after passing through Immigration) Office hours vary
 - b) From any other Service Canada location. For more information, please visit Service Canada website

Travel Restrictions/Exemptions

Travel for international students:

- 1. Must have appropriate travel documents (i.e. study permit approval)
 - Visa/eTA/US passport and Letter of Introduction from visa office
- 2. Must have valid immigration medical exam
 - Exams are valid for 1 year from date of exam
- 3. Must be fully vaccinated with a <u>Health Canada approved vaccine</u> to be authorized to enter Canada.
- 4. May be selected for random mandatory COVID-19 arrival testing. You do not need to quarantine while you wait for your test results.
- 5. Download <u>ArriveCAN app</u> and submit your travel and vaccine information within 72 hours before your arrival to Canada

Review: Find out if you can enter Canada

You should **not** travel to Canada until 4 weeks before your classes begin

NOTE: Pre-entry COVID testing and <u>quarantine plan is no longer required</u> for fully vaccinated travellers.

HOWEVER, travel requirements are subject to change. Please review the official Government of Canada travel information before departure.

Accommodation

It is your responsibility to secure accommodations in Toronto. Consider the type of accommodation that is best for you by researching costs, location, etc.

On-Campus Housing

University Health Insurance



University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP)

- Mandatory for all international students and dependents who are physically in Canada
- Coverage includes services such as doctor's visits and hospital accommodation in Ontario and emergency services in Canada.
- UHIP does not cover medications, routine dental care, etc (supplemental insurance recommended)
- The approximate cost is \$750 (Sept 1 Aug 31)*
- Your coverage will begin on 10th day of the month prior to your program start (i.e.: August 10th); if arriving earlier, ensure you have your own private insurance.

York Federation of Students (YFS) Health and Dental Plan

- Students automatically registered if they are enrolled in 15 or more credits per term.
 - Students not physically in Canada or have alternative coverage can opt-out. Details and form on the <u>YFS</u> Health & Dental website.
- Coverage includes items such as prescription drugs, dental benefit, eye exam, etc.
- 2021-2022 fees: \$262.76 (12 months of coverage).*

Health plan fees will be billed to your York U student account. Additional details to come during orientation events.


The Undergraduate Business Society

When to Arrive and What to Bring

Review what to <u>expect at the airport</u> when you arrive in Canada as an international student, as well as the <u>COVID-19</u> <u>border examination</u>. **Download the <u>ArriveCAN app</u>**.

Living on-campus? - Check the move-in times/dates so you can plan your arrival in time for Orientation. Early move-in details will be shared over the summer

☑ Important Items to Pack

- □ Valid Passport, with your Temporary Resident Visa (TRV) / eTA; or US passport*
- ☐ Letter of Introduction letter from visa office*
- ☐ Schulich Letter of Acceptance (*printed copy acceptable*)*
- ☐ Proof of funds*
- ☐ Ensure your immigration medical exam is still valid (valid for 12 months)
- ☐ Photocopies/digital copies of important documents (and send to your email)
- ☐ Download ArriveCan App 72 hours prior to departure.
- $\hfill\square$ Proof of vaccination (Health Canada approved vaccine)
- ☐ Medications, health documents and prescriptions (if applicable); check import limits for medications

Transport from Pearson International Airport

Airport Taxi (recommended)

- Taxi fares from the airport are based on a flat rate tariff.
- Fare: \$55-70 CAD approximately (tips and extra luggage fee extra).
- Travel time: 30 minutes to York campus.
- Taxis will be waiting once you exit the airport terminal. Use only authorized taxi providers.

Ride-Hailing Apps

- Use <u>Uber</u> or <u>Lyft</u> to and from airport
- Fare: approximately \$50 from airport to York U
- Uber Rider kiosk available as you leave baggage area






COVID-19 IN TORONTO

What does this mean for me?

Ontario Public Health Measures

- As of March 1, 2022:
 - Capacity limits have been lifted in indoor settings
 - Proof of vaccination requirements have been lifted (some businesses may still optionally choose to require proof)
 - Mask requirement still in place in some indoor settings (public transit, hospitals)
 - Physical distancing where possible

COVID-19 at York U

As York U community members, we all have a responsibility to keep the campus safe

- York's <u>mask protocol</u> is extended until further notice in all indoor spaces (i.e.: Schulich building, York Lanes, common areas in residence)
- York U vaccine mandate has been paused as of May 1, 2022. It is still recommended that you <u>upload</u> <u>vaccination proof.</u>
- All buildings and services are open on campus

Public Transportation

Toronto Transit Commission (TTC)



- Fare: \$3.25 cash, \$3.20 PRESTO
- Serves City of Toronto
- Closest stop: York University station
- For more information, visit: TTC website

GO Transit



- Fare: \$3-\$20 PRESTO depending on the distance; must tap on and off
- Connects to regional locations: Mississauga, Brampton, Hamilton, Scarborough, Milton etc.
- Closest stop: Highway 407 TTC station and bus terminal

Union Pearson (UP) Express

- Fare: \$12.35 by cash/credit card; or \$9.35 by **PRESTO**
- Union Station to Toronto Pearson Airport

York Region Transit (VIVA/YRT)



- Fare: \$4 cash, \$3.75 PRESTO
- Serves areas north of York University (York Region)
- Closest stop: Pioneer Village TTC station

Brampton Transit (ZÜM)



- Fare: \$4 cash, \$3.75 PRESTO
- Serves Brampton region
- Closest stop: 5 min walk north of Schulich on lan McDonald Blvd

Mississauga Transit - MiWay



- Fare: \$3.75 cash, \$3.10 PRESTO
- Serves Mississauga region
- Closest stop: Islington TTC station

Presto Card

PRESTO is accepted on all GTA transit systems

- Purchase a PRESTO card
 - o Online
 - at a PRESTO vending machine (TTC subway stations)
 - o at a customer service outlet
 - o at Shopper's Drug Mart locations that sell PRESTO cards
- Cost: \$6 for card + \$0.05 minimum load/reload if purchased in person or \$5/\$10 minimum from a vending machine
- Load in advance may take up to 24 hours to reload on-line
- Manage your card at: My PRESTO to add funds & passes and manage your profile
- Fares may vary between systems
- Additional fare when transferring between systems
- Tap your card to pay
- Hop on/off any direction for 2 hours without being charged again from the 1st time you tap on
- Research <u>Post-Secondary Monthly Pass</u> on PRESTO to save money on each transportation system
