PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA PRE-ARRIVAL CHECKLIST



Obtain Immigration Documents

- Secure <u>Accommodations</u>

<u>Please note:</u> Immigration and border information is valid as of October 17, 2022



Exchange students must apply for the **correct travel document**. The travel document you require will depend on your **country of citizenship**.

- Exchange students studying for one semester (less than 6 months) in Canada can study in Canada as a visitor. You do not require a study permit. However, you must obtain the correct travel documents based on your <u>country of citizenship</u> prior to travelling to Canada:
 - Temporary Resident Visa; or
 - □ Letter of Acceptance can be used as the 'invitation letter' requested in the TRV Application;
 - □ If you require a TRV, apply ASAP as processing times can be very lengthy
 - □ <u>Electronic Travel Authorization;</u> or
 - □ US Passport
- Exchange students studying for more than 6 months in Canada must apply for a study permit.
 - Review the <u>application requirements</u>, <u>required documents</u> and <u>processing times</u> before applying.
 A TRV or eTA will be issued upon approval, as required.
 - □ If not studying for 6 months or more, we strongly discourage students from opting for a study permit due to significant processing delays.



Travelling to the US

- Consider any planned travel to the US and whether you will need a visa or ESTA. Note: If possible, apply for your US visa before you leave your home country.
- It can be challenging to obtain US visa from Canada

International Experience Canada

 Exchange students wishing to work in Canada after their exchange term can check their eligibility for <u>International Experience Canada</u> programs. Please check to see if your program requires you to apply outside of Canada.

Working in Canada

- Exchange students are generally not authorized to work in Canada, unless you have a study permit
- If holding a study permit, work authorization does not start until you begin classes in January

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA ACCOMMODATIONS



It is your responsibility to secure adequate housing in Canada. Securing short-term housing in Toronto can be challenging and we strongly suggest that you begin your search early and use reputable sources. **Be very cautious to avoid rental scams, as these are currently on the rise in Toronto (and globally).**

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA HEALTH INSURANCE



University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP)

- Mandatory for all international students and dependents who are physically in Canada
 - Dependents must be enrolled within 30 days of arrival to avoid \$500 late fee
- Coverage includes services such as doctor's visits and hospital accommodation in Ontario and emergency services in Canada. Additional health insurance should be purchased for travel outside of Canada
- UHIP does not cover medications, routine dental care, etc (supplemental insurance recommended)
- The approximate cost is \$252 per term*
- Your coverage will begin on 10th day of the month prior to your program start (i.e.: Dec 10th); if arriving earlier, ensure you have your own private insurance.

- Optional for exchange students
- Coverage includes items such as prescription drugs, paramedical services, dental benefits, etc.
- Coverage is from Jan. 1st Aug. 31st

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA HOW TO PAY YOUR STUDENT ACCOUNT



Exchange students pay tuition to their home school; however, there are some fees you may be charged as an exchange student at Schulich. The charges you may receive on your York University student account include UHIP and on-campus housing rent (if you are living on campus)

There are three options to pay your student account:





3. Open a Canadian bank account when you arrive and pay your student account through internet banking

These options offer secure online portals for students to make payments for charges to their Student Account.

You can compare payment options and rates and choose the best one that meets your needs.

** ALWAYS remember to include your York University student number with your payments so the money goes into the correct account

<u>Please note</u>: Your York student account is <u>NOT</u> a bank account! Do <u>not</u> transfer large sums and then try to take the money out. Only transfer enough money to cover any charges you will receive

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA WHAT TO BRING



Review what to expect at the airport when you arrive in Canada.

☑ Important Items to Pack

- Valid Passport, with your Temporary Resident Visa (TRV) or electronic Travel Authorization (eTA), as required; or US passport*
- □ Letter of Introduction from the visa office (if applicable)*
- □ Your Schulich Acceptance Letter (copies acceptable)*
- □ Proof of funds*
- $\hfill\square$ Address where you will be residing*
- Photocopies/digital copies of all important documents (also send them to your email)*
- Medications, health documents and prescriptions (if applicable); check import limits for medications

COVID-19 NOTE: Vaccination, pre-entry COVID testing, quarantine and the use of ArriveCan are no longer required to enter Canada. **HOWEVER**, travel requirements are subject to change. Please review the official Government of Canada travel information before departure.

- Driver's license or international driver's license (drivetest.ca)
- □ Unlocked phone
- □ Laptop
- Power type A and B: Standard voltage is 120V, standard frequency is 60Hz <u>https://www.power-plugs-</u> sockets.com/canada/
- □ Business attire for presentations and career events
- □ Weather appropriate clothing for the <u>season</u>
- $\hfill\square$ Credit card(s) and money for immediate use upon arrival
- □ York U Campus Map

ARRIVAL AT YORK UNIVERSITY YU-CARD

The YU-card is York University's official photo identification & campus debit card. It provides access to key services such as library, recreation facilities, exams, food, shopping, events, discounts and more

How to get your YU-card:

- 1. Use the Photo Upload Tool on the YU Card website to upload your photo
- 2. You will receive photo approval in your @yorku.ca email account.
- 3. After approval, you can select Mail Delivery or In-Person pickup

What do I need to bring to pick up my YU-card?

• Your York U student number

• One piece of valid government-issued photo identification, such as: Passport, Ontario driver's license, Canadian citizenship card

How to load money onto your YU-card

Add money <u>online</u>

J-card

• At a YU-card station located in any York campus library or at the YU-card Office located at 200 William Small Centre









Purchase a PRESTO card <u>online</u>, at a PRESTO vending machine (TTC subway stations) or at a Shopper's Drug Mart locations that sell PRESTO cards Cost: \$6 for card + deposit; reloadable

Fares vary between systems; additional fare when transferring between systems

- Tap your card to pay
- Hop on/off any direction for 2 hours without being charged again from the 1st time you tap on
- Research Post-Secondary Monthly Pass on PRESTO to save money on each transportation system

Toronto Transit Commission (TTC)

- Fare: \$3.25 cash, \$3.20 PRESTO
- Serves City of Toronto
- Closest stop: York University station

GO Transit
