Method of instruction	In-person modality.
	The default mode of delivery of teaching and learning will be in-person and on campus for all classes offered in AY2023-24. Students on exchange will not be able to take courses remotely at CEIBS. We will send you immediate updates when there are any changes.
	Generally, classes are delivered in a lecture format. Course organization varies according to different professors, and it may involve group projects, case studies and presentations.
Visa and	Exchange students are required to obtain an "X2" visa for entry into China.
Travel Restrictions	Regrettably, the suspension of X-2 study visa (short-term, exchange student visa) to China is still in place, and there are no signs when or on what conditions would the restrictions be lifted.
	It is not guaranteed that international exchange students would secure a visa to China in the upcoming academic year.
	CEIBS International Office and MBA office will follow up the issue closely and help provide school letters if the aforementioned travel ban is discontinued in due course.
Enrollment Requirements	Language of Proficiency: All CEIBS MBA courses are taught in English. Exchange students should acquire proficiency in English.
	Academic/Experience Requirements:
	Second year MBA candidates only. First-year MBA core courses are not available to exchange students.
	CEIBS MBA students have 5-6 years of working experience on average and their average age is 29.
Class Attendance	Class attendance is mandatory. The normal class size for an elective course is 40-60. Students must be seated according to the given seating chart, to assist the faculty in evaluating the class participation.
	Students are required to attend all registered courses as scheduled. - 10 minutes late or absence in the middle of a class will be considered as absence for the class. One late arrival within 10 minutes will be counted as
	 0.5 absence. Absence in 25% or more of the total sessions of one course will result in a mandatory reduction of the final grades or exclusion from the class, regardless of the reason for absence.
	 A student missing 50% or more of the classes of any particular course will automatically fail the course and will not be granted credit for the course. All absences are counted toward the students' grade performance, regardless of the reason or the permission granted. Faculty members may also impose grading penalties for absences of less than 25% of sessions according to their own grading criteria.

Facilities Upon arrival, each exchange student will get a CEIBS student ID card during registration. With this ID, the student has access to all the facilities on campus, e.g. library, computer center, gymnasium, etc.

Health Insurance Health Insurance is compulsory, and must cover the entire exchange period.

The insurance plan shall cover outpatient and inpatient benefits, critical illness, disability and life benefits, medical evacuation & repatriation, etc.

We strongly recommend exchange students to obtain it from home institution before coming to CEIBS. All students must provide a copy of their Health Insurance Coverage one month earlier before arrival.



Expected Workload	Exchange student joining the full exchange term is required to complete at least 4 credits. (at least 2 credits for exchange students joining only half of the term).
	 Most electives are 2-credit each, equivalent to 21 class contact hours. Few courses are 1-credit, equivalent to 10 class contact hours.
	Course offerings are subject to change each year. Detailed course list and syllabus will be released 2-3 months before the exchange program starts.
