NOMINATION PROCESS AND DEADLINE

The Student Exchange Coordinator from partner school must send their nomination to AIM's contact person before May 1. The email must include the student's full name, school email address and a copy of the student's one page CV/resume.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS AND DEADLINE

1. Completed two-page AIM application form
2. High resolution picture in .jpg format
3. Clear copy of the student's passport information page

4. A recent copy of the student's school transcript, in English
5. Verification of English proficiency

Application forms will be provided by AIM after officially receiving the student nomination from the partner school. All completed documents should be emailed to AIM's contact person before May 15.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

- ✓ Students must be in their senior year of the school's MBA or Master program.
- ✓ Students must have one-year of relevant work experience through full/part-time management jobs or internships.
- ✓ Students must be proficient in English. Students who are not native speakers of English must have an English language proficiency score between 80-120 (TOEFL). A language proficiency letter signed by the home university will be accepted for students who do not have an official test score.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION

All courses are taught in English.



COURSE WORKLOAD

The maximum elective workload for exchange students is 10 AIM units.

LEARNING METHODOLOGY

Class Format: AIM uses the case method, which means students are expected to participate actively in live, extemporaneous discussion. For most courses, class participation accounts for more than 50% of the total grade. Students may also be asked to perform field research by hands-on field projects. Students may be sent to corporate internships. Management games and simulations are also used. The AIM culture emphasizes analysis of facts, exploration of alternative courses of action, and simulates real life managerial decision-making experiences.

Exams: Exams are given on a case-to-case basis. In lieu of exams, students are required to submit group projects, individual reflection papers and reports.

TRANSCRIPT OF RECORDS

A copy of the official transcript will be emailed to the partner school's exchange office two months after the end of term. Should a physical copy be required, the student must inform AIM's contact person.



VISA REQUIREMENTS

International students who are accepted for study in AIM are required to secure a 47(a)(2) Special Non-Immigrant single entry visa. It is a visa similarly granted to expatriate businessmen, among others. Do not attempt to come in under a tourist visa. Declare if you have dual citizenship.

The initial 47(a)(2) visa is a single-entry visa and is valid for travel within three months upon issuance. The process is fixed by law. Requirements vary from country to country. Please check with the Philippine Embassy/Consulate nearest you for the requirements of the single-entry visa. AIM is required by the Department of Justice and Department of Foreign Affairs to apply for entry clearances to support the visa application of the student. The student can only apply for the 47(a)(2) visa at the home country after the entry clearances have been approved.

Upon arrival, AIM's Office of the Registrar will handle the filing of the validity extension. The visa extension will do two things.

- It will extend the validity of the visa to cover the entire duration of the program.
- It will allow the student multiple-entry privileges.

To allow AIM to facilitate your visa clearances and extensions, the Office of the Registrar requires you to submit the following upon arrival in AIM:

- Passport (valid for at least 18 months from the time classes start)
- Application form to be provided by the Office of the Registrar
- Visa extension fee is approximately US\$ 135

The submission of the requirements for the visa extension should be done within the first two weeks of arrival in AIM. The extension process may take up to eight weeks. Students are advised that they cannot travel outside the Philippines while their visa extensions are being processed.
