## **Application Procedure**

1. Partner universities nominate their students for an Exchange program at Macquarie university within the corresponding time frame. Nominations are submitted through our <u>Nomination Form</u>.

The following documents must be attached to each nomination:

- Academic transcripts: If your student is applying to a postgraduate program, postgraduate transcripts and undergraduate transcripts and degree award are required.
- Proof of English language proficiency (if applicable):
  - Such as IELTS (Academic) Minimum requirement: 6.5 overall with 6.0 in each section. For a
    detailed list of other acceptable levels of English proficiency and English language package
    providers as approved by Macquarie University, please refer to our English Language
    Requirements page OR
  - Other supporting documentation as per application requirements previously agreed upon by Macquarie University.

Once the student's nomination has been approved by Macquarie University, the student home university will send the application link to apply for the Exchange program.
