PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA

Immigration Documents

International Degree-Seeking Students

- A study permit is required for all students completing a program longer than 6 months in Canada. You should have already applied for your study permit.
- If you are **OUTSIDE** of Canada:
 - Must apply <u>for your study permit</u> in sufficient time to receive approval before the start of classes; processing times may be lengthy
 - Review the <u>application guide</u>, <u>supporting documents</u> and <u>processing times</u> before applying
 - Drop in to a <u>Q&A session</u>, if you need additional support.
 - Depending on your <u>country of citizenship</u>, to enter Canada you will also require:
 - □ Temporary Resident Visa (TRV); or
 - □ Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA); or
 - US Passport
 - <u>Letter of Introduction</u> (study permit approval letter) will be sent by IRCC; you will need to show this letter at the border
 - Study permit will be issued at the border when you arrive
- If you are **INSIDE** Canada:
 - Must have a valid study permit before starting your classes. Apply to <u>extend study permit, or change conditions</u> (for work/visitor permit holders)

Visas and Work Authorization

Work Authorization

- Your study permit may <u>authorize you to work</u> in Canada. Authorization begins only after you start your classes in Canada
- More detailed information on work authorization and immigration status will be provided during the New to Canada orientation.

Accompanying Family Members

• Your spouse/partner and children may be eligible to <u>come with you</u> to Canada. Accompanying spouses/partners of study permit holders are eligible to apply for an <u>open work permit</u>

Social Insurance Number (SIN)

- The SIN is a 9-digit number that you need to work in Canada and file your taxes. You can apply for a SIN with a valid study permit that states work authorization (check this when they print your permit at the point of entry)
- How to apply?
 - Alternatively, you can apply:
 - <u>in person</u> or <u>online</u> (from within Canada)
 - At Pearson airport upon arrival, if Service Canada kiosk is open

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA Accommodation

It is your responsibility to secure accommodations in Toronto. Consider the type of accommodation that is best for you by researching costs, location, etc.

On-Campus Housing – York Apartments

- · Housing for graduate students and families
- Lease-based occupancy
- Furnished and unfurnished apartments you will need to obtain your own bedding, small kitchen appliances and other items

Off-Campus Housing

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA University Health Insurance

University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP)

- Mandatory for all international students and dependents who are physically in Canada • Dependents must be enrolled within 30 days of arrival to avoid \$500 late fee
- Coverage includes services such as doctor's visits and hospital accommodation in Ontario and emergency services in Canada.
- UHIP does not cover medications, routine dental care, etc (*supplemental insurance recommended*)
- The approximate cost is \$504 (Jan 1st Aug 31st) *
- Students will be automatically registered and charged; check your student account
- Your coverage will begin on 10th day of the month prior to your program start (i.e.: Dec. 10th); if arriving earlier, ensure you have your own private insurance.

Graduate Student Association (GSA) Supplemental Health Insurance

- All full-time students will be automatically registered and charged; check your <u>student account</u>
 - Coverage includes items such as prescription drugs, paramedical services, dental benefits, etc.
- The approximate cost is \$375 from Jan 1st Aug 31^{st*}
- If you have dependents in Canada, register them through Green Shield Canada
- Deadline for <u>all</u> to opt-in or opt-out: Jan 30, 2024

PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA Packing List

Review what to expect at the airport when you arrive in Canada

Important Items to Pack

- □ Valid Passport, with your Temporary Resident Visa (TRV) or electronic Travel Authorization (eTA), as required; or US passport*
- Letter of Introduction letter from visa office*
- □ Your Schulich Letter of Acceptance (*printed copy*) acceptable)*
- \Box Proof of funds*
- Ensure your immigration medical exam is still valid
- Photocopies/digital copies of all important documents (also send them to your email)*
- □ Medications, health documents and prescriptions (if applicable); check import limits for medications
- Medical insurance documents for any additional health/travel coverage (if applicable)

- Driver's license or international driver's license (<u>drivetest.ca</u>); driver's abstract/history Credit card(s) and Canadian dollars for immediate use upon arrival
- □ Power type A and B: Standard voltage is 120V,

standard frequency is 60Hz https://www.power-

- □ Unlocked phone
- Laptop
- Business attire for presentations and career

- □ Weather appropriate clothing for the <u>season</u>

ARRIVAL IN TORONTO

Transportation from Pearson International Airport

Airport Taxi (recommended)

- Taxi fares from the airport are based on a flat rate tariff
- Fare : \$50-60 CAD approximately (tips and extra luggage fee extra)
- Travel time: 30 minutes to York campus
- Taxis will be waiting once you exit the airport terminal. Use only authorized taxi providers
- For information on taxi services, visit the <u>Pearson Airport</u> website

Ride-Hailing Apps

- Use <u>Uber</u> or <u>Lyft</u> to and from airport
- Fare: approximately \$50 from airport to York U
- Uber Rider kiosk available as you leave baggage area

Airport Train to Downtown - Union Pearson (UP) Express

- Fare: \$12.35 by cash/credit card or \$9.35 by PRESTO
- Connects to Union and Bloor subway stations
- Travel time: 25 minutes to Union Station (downtown)
- Pick up locations and schedules, see <u>UPExpress at Pearson</u>







- Serves City of Toronto
- Closest stop: York University station

York Region Transit (VIVA/YRT)

- Fare: \$4.25 cash, \$3.88 PRESTO
- Serves areas north of York University (York Region)
- Closest stop: Pioneer Village TTC station
- For more information, visit: <u>YRT website</u>

Mississauga Transit - MiWay



- Fare: \$4 cash, \$3.10 PRESTO
- Serves Mississauga region
- Closest stop: Islington TTC station
- For more information: visit: <u>MiWay website</u>

GO Transit



- Fare: \$3-\$20 PRESTO depending on the distance; must tap on and off
- Connects to regional locations: Mississauga, Brampton, Hamilton, Scarborough, Milton etc.
- Closest stop: Highway 407 TTC station and bus terminal

Brampton Transit (ZÜM)



- Fare: \$4 cash, \$3.10 PRESTO
- Serves Brampton region
- Closest stop: 5 min walk north of Schulich on Ian McDonald Blvd

ARRIVAL IN TORONTO

Public Transportation - Presto Card

PRESTO is accepted on all GTA transit systems

- Purchase a PRESTO card
 - o <u>Online</u>
 - o at a PRESTO vending machine (TTC subway stations)
 - o at a customer service outlet
 - \circ $\;$ at Shopper's Drug Mart locations that sell PRESTO cards
- Cost: \$6 for card + \$0.05 minimum load/reload if purchased in person or \$5/\$10 minimum from a vending machine
- Load in advance may take up to 24 hours to reload on-line
- Manage your card at: <u>PRESTO</u> to add funds & passes and manage your profile
- Fares may vary between systems
- Additional fare when transferring between systems
- Tap your card to pay
- Hop on/off any direction for 2 hours without being charged again from the 1st time you tap on
- Research <u>Post-Secondary Monthly Pass</u> on PRESTO to save money on each transportation system
