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About AGSM and UNSW

AGSM @ UNSW Business School has 45 years history of leadership in Australia, and our globally ranked MBA programs are taught by internationally recognised faculty with industry experience. AGSM students are immersed in active learning experiences and exposed to practical skills and tools they can immediately apply to real-world business problems.

The AGSM Full-Time MBA consistently ranks in the top 100 global MBA programs and in 2021 ranked 79th in the Financial Times UK Rankings and 35th in the QS Global MBA 2022 Rankings. It is one of the top full-time programs in Australia and is ranked 8th in the world for non-US two-year MBA programs according (Forbes biennial rankings 2019).

The University of New South Wales (UNSW Sydney) was established in 1949 and has over 59,000 students, including 7,000+ international students from 128+ countries. UNSW offers more than 300 undergraduate and 600 postgraduate programs and has developed an extensive network of alumni chapters throughout Asia, Europe and the US. The main UNSW campus is located on a 38-hectare site at Kensington, five kilometres from Bondi Beach and seven kilometres from the centre of Sydney.

AGSM MBA Study Program

AGSM offers a variety of elective courses in the following subject disciplines: Sustainability, Finance, Statistics, Strategy, Social Impact, Organisational Behaviour, Operations Management and General Management.

Course Enrolment

The enrolment period begins approximately two months before the beginning of a corresponding term. The Exchange Coordinator will update incoming students regarding course availability and will enrol incoming students in their courses. Some courses have limited spots, so students are required to provide the Exchange Coordinator with one back-up option.

Study Load

Exchange students are required to undertake a full-time course load while studying at the AGSM. A standard full-time load in the AGSM MBA is three courses or 18 units of credit (uoc). Each course is 6 units of credits and has 36 contact hours per term. Students must enrol in a minimum of three (18uoc) and a maximum of four (24uoc) courses.

Exchange students will only be permitted to enrol at less than a full-time load in the AGSM MBA Program if their home institution specifies this requirement and if they meet their visa needs.

If more than 4 courses is needed for program completion, a formal written request from the student and verification from the home institution is required *prior* to arrival, during the course selection process.

Visa Information	Students will need to obtain a visa to study on the exchange program at AGSM. We recommend that students contact the Australian embassy nearest to them or search the <u>Department of Home Affairs: Immigration and Citizenship website</u> to determine which visa will best suit their individual needs and the steps required to complete the visa application.
	Student Visa
	Exchange students intending to study on a student visa must purchase <u>Overseas Student</u> <u>Health Cover (OSHC)</u> prior to arriving in Australia and maintain OSHC for the entire time that they are in Australia. This is a student visa condition required by the Australian Government.
	UNSW's preferred OSHC provider is: <u>Medibank Private</u> . For further information about other OSHC providers, please refer to the Fact Sheet on the <u>Department of Health website</u> .
	Tourist Visa
	Please note that students on tourist visas are not eligible to purchase the compulsory Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC), however you must obtain travel insurance with an alternate insurance provider. This link may help: <u>http://www.iselect.com.au/overseas-visitors-</u> <u>cover/</u>
	Working Holiday Visa
	For students under the age of 30 and holder of a specific passport (noted on the site), the <u>Working Holiday visa</u> may be an option. As for the tourist visa you must have travel insurance.
Expected Arrival Date	Please confirm the term dates and expected arrival dates with the AGSM Exchange Coordinator <u>before</u> booking your flights. Once you have made your travel arrangements, please advise AGSM of your arrival date.
Accommodation and Living Expenses	AGSM does not provide accommodation for students. Students should be aware that housing and living costs will vary considerably depending on whether students join shared accommodation or establish their own accommodation.

Please note that students should also consider the additional costs involved in establishing their accommodation. As new tenants, students are likely to be required to pay a bond, usually of one month's rent, but at the very least two week's rent, in advance.

In most instances, students will also be responsible for paying connection fees associated with the establishment of gas, telephone and electricity service. Most Sydney apartments are unfurnished, so students should also budget for the purchase of essential household items (furniture, linen, kitchen utensils, etc.)

Occasionally the <u>UNSW Student Accommodation service</u> may have some short-term and private furnished rental options. It's also a good idea join UNSW and AGSM Student Facebook groups to enquire about housing.
