Immigration Documents

Study Permits

- International students studying for longer than 6 months require a <u>study permit</u> to study inside Canada
- You must have a valid study permit prior to the start of the program

If you are outside of Canada:

- Apply online for your study permit. APPLY AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, as processing times are lengthy.
- Review the <u>application guide</u>, <u>supporting documents</u> and <u>processing times</u> before applying.
- Depending on your <u>country of citizenship</u>, you will also be issued a temporary resident visa (TRV) or electronic travel authorization (eTA) to enter Canada (exception for US citizens)
- Upon approval, you should receive a Letter of Introduction from the visa office; required to board a flight
- Study permit will be issued at the border when you arrive

If you are inside Canada with a valid study permit:

- You should apply to extend your study permit BEFORE your current permit expires
- You can begin your program with your current study permit IF it is still valid, or if you apply to extend your current permit before it expires
- Your new permit will be mailed to you

Visas and Work Authorization

Work Authorization

- Your study permit may <u>authorize you to work</u> in Canada. Authorization begins only after you start your classes in Canada
- More detailed information on work authorization and immigration status available during International Student Orientation on August 26, 2024.

Social Insurance Number (SIN)

- The SIN is a 9-digit number that you need to work in Canada and file your taxes. You can apply for a SIN with a valid study permit that states work authorization (check this when you receive your study permit document)
- You may apply for one <u>online</u>:
 - a) From the Service Canada SIN Clinic at York University (recommended)
 - b) From the Service Canada Online Application Portal
- You may apply for one <u>in person</u>:
 - a) From the SIN clinic at Schulich on Aug. 30th, 2024
 - b) Service Canada office at Pearson Airport (after passing through Immigration) Office hours vary
 - c) From any other Service Canada location. For more information, please visit Service Canada website

Accommodation

It is your responsibility to secure accommodations in Toronto. Consider the type of accommodation that is best for you by researching costs, location, etc. APPLY EARLY!!

University Health Insurance



University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP)

- Mandatory for all international students and dependents who are physically in Canada
- Coverage includes services such as doctor's visits and hospital accommodation in Ontario and emergency services in Canada.
- UHIP does not cover medications, routine dental care, etc (supplemental insurance recommended)
- The approximate cost is \$756 (Sept 1 Aug 31)*
- Students will be automatically registered and charges will be applied to your student account
- Your coverage will begin on 10th day of the month prior to your program start (i.e.: August 10th); if arriving earlier, ensure you have your own private insurance.

York Federation of Students (YFS) Health and Dental Plan

- Students automatically registered if they are enrolled in 15 or more credits per term.
 - Students who have comparable alternative coverage may be eligible to opt-out. Details and form on the YFS Health & Dental website.
- Coverage includes services such as prescription drugs, dental and vision care, eye exam, and paramedical services (physiotherapy, massage therapy, psychotherapy, etc)
- The approximate cost is \$281.32 (Sept 1st Aug 31). Charges will be applied to your student account

Health plan fees will be billed to your York U student account. Additional details provided during orientation events.

Transport from Pearson International Airport

Airport Taxi (recommended)

- Taxi fares from the airport are based on a flat rate tariff.
- Fare: \$55-70 CAD approximately (tips and extra luggage fee extra).
- Travel time: 30 minutes to York campus.
- Taxis will be waiting once you exit the airport terminal. Use only authorized taxi providers.

Ride-Hailing Apps

- Use <u>Uber</u> or <u>Lyft</u> to and from airport
- Fare: approximately \$50 from airport to York U
- Uber Rider kiosk available as you leave baggage area

Airport Train to Downtown - Union Pearson (UP) Express

- Fare: \$12.35 by cash/credit card or \$9.35 by PRESTO
- Connects to Union and Bloor subway stations
- Travel time: 25 minutes to Union Station (downtown)
- Pick up locations and schedules, see UPExpress at Pearson





Note: we strongly discourage the use of public transportation (TTC) when first arriving in Toronto

Public Transportation in the GTA

Toronto Transit Commission (TTC)



- Serves City of Toronto
- Can tap multiple times in 2-hr window for one fare
- Closest stop: York University station
- For more information, visit: <u>TTC website</u>

York Region Transit (VIVA/YRT)



- Serves areas north of York University (York Region)
- Closest stop: Pioneer Village TTC station
- For more information, visit: <u>YRT website</u>

Mississauga Transit - MiWay



- Serves Mississauga region
- Closest stop: Islington TTC station
- For more information: visit: MiWay website

Consider a <u>PRESTO Card</u> for student discount and other perks.

GO Transit



- Connects to regional locations: Mississauga,
 Brampton, Hamilton, Scarborough, Milton etc.
- Closest stop: Highway 407 TTC station and bus terminal
- For more information, visit: GO website

Brampton Transit (ZÜM)

Serves Brampton region



- Closest stop: 5 min walk north of Schulich on Ian McDonald Blvd
- For more information, visit: ZÜM website

Note: Fares vary across transportation systems (usually approx. \$3.30-\$4.00/ride) and can be paid by cash or by tapping debit/credit card/PRESO card. Cash fares are usually slightly more expensive. <u>OneFare Program</u> in effect for most GTA transportation systems.

Know your Campus


The YU-card is York University's official photo identification & campus debit card. It provides access to key services such as library, recreation facilities, exams, food, shopping, events, discounts and more.


York has recently instituted a mobile YU-Card. Please note: students must choose between a physical card and the mobile version – having both is not an option.
