Exchange students must apply for the **correct Canadian immigration document.** The document you require will depend on your **country of citizenship** and **length of exchange.** 

### One Semester Exchange

- Exchange students studying for **one semester (less than 6 months) in Canada** can study in Canada as a visitor. You do NOT need a study permit. If you wish to apply for a study permit, you MUST connect with our immigration advising team before applying
- You must obtain the correct travel documents based on your <u>country of citizenship</u> prior to travelling to Canada:
  - <u>Electronic Travel Authorization</u>; or
  - <u>Temporary Resident Visa</u>; or
    - Letter of Acceptance can be used as the 'invitation letter' requested in the TRV Application;
    - If you require a TRV, apply ASAP as processing times can be very lengthy
  - US Passport

### Two Semester (1 Year) Exchange

- Exchange students studying for more than 6 months in Canada must apply for a study permit.
- Undergraduate 1-year exchange students are EXEMPT from the requirement for a **Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL).** A PAL exemption letter has been provided to you with your Letter of Acceptance.
- Review the <u>application requirements</u>, <u>required documents</u> and <u>processing times</u> before applying. A TRV or eTA will be issued upon approval, as required.
- Apply ASAP for your study permit, as processing times can be lengthy

# PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA Accommodation



It is a student's responsibility to secure accommodations in Toronto. Securing short-term housing in Toronto can be challenging; we strongly suggest students begin to search early and use reputable sources. **Be very cautious to avoid rental scams, as these are currently on the rise in Toronto (and globally).**

# **PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA** University Health Insurance





### **University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP)**

- Mandatory for all international students and dependents who are physically in Canada
  - Dependents must be enrolled within 30 days of arrival to avoid \$500 late fee
- Coverage includes services such as doctor's visits and hospital accommodation in Ontario and emergency services in Canada. Additional health insurance should be purchased for travel outside of Canada
- UHIP does not cover medications, routine dental care, etc (supplemental insurance recommended)
- The approximate cost is \$252 per term\*
- Your coverage will begin on 10<sup>th</sup> day of the month prior to your program start (i.e.: Aug 10<sup>th</sup>); if arriving earlier, ensure you have your own private insurance.

### York University Graduate Students' Association (YUGSA) Health Plan & York Federation of Students (YFS) Health & Dental Plan

- Optional for exchange students
- Coverage includes items such as prescription drugs, paramedical services, dental benefits, etc.
- Coverage is from Sep. 1<sup>st</sup> Aug. 31<sup>st</sup>
- Graduate students: the approximate cost is \$375.\* For more information, please visit the <u>GSA Health Plan</u> website
- Undergraduate students: the approximate cost is \$260.\* For more information, please visit the <u>YFS website</u>

# PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA How to Pay Your Student Account



Exchange students pay tuition to their home school; however, there are some fees you may be charged as an exchange student at Schulich. The charges you may receive on your York University student account include UHIP and on-campus housing rent (if you are living on campus)

### Paying from an International Bank Account

3. Open a Canadian bank account when you arrive and pay your student account through internet banking

These options offer secure online portals for students to make payments for charges to their Student Account

You can compare payment options and rates and choose the best one that meets your needs

\*\* ALWAYS remember to include your York University student number with your payments so the money goes into the correct account

<u>Please note</u>: Your York student account is <u>NOT</u> a bank account! Do <u>not</u> transfer large sums and then try to take the money out. Only transfer enough money to cover any charges you will receive

# PREPARING TO ARRIVE IN CANADA Packing List



### Review what to expect at the airport when you arrive in Canada

### **☑** Important Items to Pack

- □ Valid Passport, with your Temporary Resident Visa (TRV) or electronic Travel Authorization (eTA), as required; or US passport\*
- □ Letter of Introduction from the visa office (if applicable)\*
- □ Your Schulich Acceptance Letter (copies acceptable)\*
- □ Proof of funds\*
- $\Box$  Address where you will be residing\*
- □ Photocopies/digital copies of all important documents (also send them to your email)\*
- Medications, health documents and prescriptions (if applicable); check <u>import limits</u> for medications
- Medical insurance documents for any additional health/travel coverage (if applicable)

- Driver's license or international driver's license (drivetest.ca); driver's abstract/history
- □ Credit card(s) and Canadian dollars for immediate use upon arrival
- Power type A and B: Standard voltage is 120V, standard frequency is 60Hz https://www.power-plugs
  - sockets.com/canada/
- □ Unlocked phone
- □ Laptop
- □ Business attire for presentations and career events
- $\Box$  Weather appropriate clothing for the <u>season</u>
- □ York U Campus Map

\* Pack items in your carry-on luggage as you will be <u>required to show these to the border officer</u> upon arrival (before getting your checked luggage)

# **ARRIVAL IN TORONTO** Transferring from Pearson International Airport

### Airport Taxi (recommended)

- Taxi fares from the airport are based on a flat rate tariff
- Fare : \$50-60 CAD approximately (tips and extra luggage fee extra)
- Travel time: 30 minutes to York campus
- Taxis will be waiting once you exit the airport terminal. Use only authorized taxi providers
- For information on taxi services, visit the <u>Pearson Airport</u> website

### **Ride-Hailing Apps**

- Use <u>Uber</u> or <u>Lyft</u> to and from airport
- Fare: approximately \$50 from airport to York U
- Uber Rider kiosk available as you leave baggage area

### Airport Train to Downtown - Union Pearson (UP) Express

- Fare: \$12.35 by cash/credit card or save 40% with PRESTO
- Connects to Union and Bloor subway stations
- Travel time: 25 minutes to Union Station (downtown)
- Pick up locations and schedules, see <u>UPExpress at Pearson</u>





Note: We strongly discourage the use of public transportation (TTC) when first arriving in Toronto with all your luggage



# ARRIVAL IN TORONTO Public Transportation





Tap your payment method on the card reader: \$3.35

- Pay TTC fare when transferring between systems and GO fare if using GO train or bus
- Hop on/off any direction for 2 hours (3 hours if using GO) without being charged again from the 1<sup>st</sup> time you tap on

### PRESTO is accepted on all GTA transit systems

- Purchase a PRESTO card
  - Online
  - at a PRESTO vending machine (TTC subway stations)
  - at a <u>customer service outlet</u>
  - at Shopper's Drug Mart locations that sell PRESTO cards
- Cost: \$4 for card + \$0.05 minimum load/reload if purchased in person or \$5/\$10 minimum from a vending machine
  - Load in advance may take up to 24 hours to reload on-line
  - Manage your card at <u>PRESTO</u> to add funds & passes and manage your profile
- Research <u>Post-Secondary Monthly Pass</u> on PRESTO to save money on each transportation system
- A PRESTO card provides access to "<u>PRESTO Perks</u>" receive discounts to some attractions and events



# ARRIVAL AT YORK UNIVERSITY YU-Card


